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Example 1: Is the restriction of the freedom of movement of an infected and thus contagious person outweighed by the fact that it prevents the infection of other people? What is more important here: The protection of life and the basic law of physical intactness (in article 2, fundamental law), or is there a possibility that the restriction of freedom of movement for those affected could lead to even more serious violations of other rights?

example 2: How far may state coercion go in view of Art. 1 of the Basic Law, according to which the dignity of humans is inviolable? This article 1 is a special basic right, because it does not allow any exceptions. But is not the dignity of an old person in a nursing home affected if he or she has to die in involuntary isolation without being able to be visited by relatives?
