

## Online Safety – Young People Online

Slide 1 – Introductions and explanation of what the WakeUP! Project is.

- WakeUP! Encourages young people to volunteer and make real changes to their communities.
- Through training and workshops, young people are motivated and supported to develop their own ideas so they run and deliver volunteering projects. **This workshop was designed for young people, by young people.**

Slide 5 – Buzz words

- There are so many buzz words around the internet that you might not know what they mean.
  - o Examples on slide. Ask participants to try and explain some of them.
    - PC – A computer made my Microsoft (they make Xboxes)
    - Mac – A computer made my apple (they make iPhones)
    - Tablet – a larger device used to view content.
    - Smartphone – a smaller device to view content as well as make calls and texts.
    - Edge and Chrome – examples of browsers (programmes to browse the internet)
    - Apps – apps can be games, programmes to access social media etc.

Slide 6 – What device should I use?

- For your everyday needs, it doesn't really matter. You can do all of your basic activities on any of these devices.

Slide 7 – Explanation of operating systems.

- Operating systems are the essentially the nuts and bolts that run your devices.
  - o iOS – apple products
  - o Android – Samsung, Huawei, LG
  - o Windows – Microsoft products

Slide 8 – pros and cons of using social media.

- Breakout room activity where participants will discuss the pros and cons to internet use and then feedback to the whole group.
